





SOUTH WESTERN SYDNEY CAMPUS

With people from more than 150 countries calling Liverpool home, the UOW South Western Sydney campus is a culturally vibrant and welcoming place to study. The campus is located on Moore Street, in the heart of Liverpool. You can step out of the classroom and find yourself amongst a world of food, shopping and entertainment.

FOOD

Spice up your lunch break with an Indian curry, grab a post-lecture treat from an Afghani bakery or order some pizza or Thai food – you're never short of options on the streets around campus.

COFFEE

Cycling – If you choose to cycle to class, Liverpool City Council offers a number of bike racks in its Dewsbury Lane carpark.







UNIVERSITY PATHWAY PROGRAMS



University Access Program

Wollongong (Mature Age Students)

University Access Program (UAP) students at the Wollongong campus are encouraged to apply for a Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP). UAP students who receive a CSP are not required to pay a student contribution amount to cover their tuition. There are a limited number of CSPs available for this course.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The University Access Program (UAP) is a 14-week course to give you the fundamental skills and habits required for university study and maximise your chance of success. It is specifically designed for mature age students who would like to start their academic journey or did not meet the entry requirements to study at UOW.

After successful completion of the course, you are guaranteed* entry to most UOW undergraduate bachelor degrees.

You can choose from two streams of subjects relevant to your chosen UOW degree.

Stream 1 - Humanities or

Stream 2 - Information Technology, Engineering, Science, Health and Behavioural Science.

Completion of an additional subject (Enabling Mathematics) is also required for some UOW degree offers from Stream 2.

Autumn Session (February) Spring Session (June) Summer Session (October)

CAMPUS:

UOW College Wollongong

DURATION:

One session (14 weeks) full time (nine hours per week), or parttime equivalent.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

- Age: 21 +
- Stream 1 Minimum ATAR 35.
- Stream 2 Minimum ATAR 35, plus minimum 60% for Year 12 HSC Mathematics Standard 2.
- Non-ATAR applicants will be required to complete a basic literacy and numeracy online test to determine eligibility into the course.

If any of the above entry requirements are not met or if an applicant is under the age of 21, applications will be assessed on a case-by-case basis taking into account the applicant's work and life experience

GUARANTEED* ENTRY INTO UOW BACHELOR:

Successful completion of the UAP provides guaranteed* entry to most UOW undergraduate bachelor degrees. There are no pathways from this course into double degrees, four-year professional degrees, Law, Nutrition and Dietetics, Nursing, Education (except Education - The Early Years) or Economics and Finance. If you wish to enter into one of the above study areas, please contact us to discuss alternative pathways available.

University Access Program

- South Western Sydney, Shoalhaven and Batemans Bay (School Leavers and Mature Age Students)

UAC Code 759005 Liverpool UAC Code 759006 Shoalhaven UAC Code 759007 Batemans Bay

This course is FEE FREE at the South Western Sydney campus in 2019.

University Access Program (UAP) students at the Shoalhaven and Batemans Bay campus are encouraged to apply for a Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP). UAP students who receive a CSP are not required to pay a student contribution amount to cover their tuition. There are a limited number of CSPs available for this course.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The UAP is a 14-week course to give you the fundamental skills and habits required for university study and maximise your chance of success. It is specifically designed for students who would like to start their academic journey or did not meet the entry requirements to study at UOW.

Please note: UOW South Western Sydney, Shoalhaven and Batemans Bay campuses only offer Stream 1 - Humanities.

Autumn Session (February) Spring Session (June) Summer Session (October)

CAMPUS:

UOW College South Western Sydney: Autumn, Spring and Summer Sessions

UOW College Batemans Bay: Spring Session only

UOW College Shoalhaven: Spring Session only

DURATION:

One session (14 weeks) full-time (nine hours per week), or part time equivalent.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum ATAR 35.
- Non-ATAR applicants will be required to complete a basic literacy and numeracy online test to determine eligibility into the course.

If the above entry requirements are not met, applications will be assessed on a case by case basis taking into account the applicant's work and life experience.

GUARANTEED* ENTRY INTO UOW BACHELOR:

Successful completion of the UAP provides guaranteed* entry to most UOW undergraduate bachelor degrees. There are no pathways from this course into double degrees, four-year professional degrees, Law, Nutrition and Dietetics, Nursing, Education (except Education - The Early Years) or Economics and Finance. If you wish to enter into one of the above study areas, please contact us to discuss alternative pathways available.

University Entrance Certificate (School Leavers)

UAC Code 759000

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The University Entrance Certificate (UEC) is a university preparation course specifically designed for students who have not met the direct entry requirements for a UOW bachelor degree, or who did not receive an ATAR from their secondary schooling.

The course comprises a stream of subjects relevant to your chosen UOW bachelor degree. When you enrol in the program, you will be allocated to the relevant stream of study.

Stream 1 - Arts, Business, Commerce, Humanities, Social Science or

Stream 2 - Business Information systems, Information Technology or

Steam 3 - Computer Science, Engineering, Mathematics, Nuclear Science, Physics or

Stream 4 - Health Science, Nutrition Science, Science.

You will develop study skills and habits, including time management, essay writing, group work and presentation skills, and become familiar with the academic standards and expectations at university.

Autumn Session (February) Spring Session (June) Summer Session (October)

CAMPUS:

UOW College Wollongong

DURATION:

Two sessions (14 weeks per session) full time (average three to four days per week), or part-time equivalent.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

- Stream 1 Minimum ATAR 35.
- Stream 2 and Stream 4 Minimum ATAR 35, plus minimum 60% for Year 12 HSC Mathematics Standard 2.
- Stream 3 Minimum ATAR 35, plus minimum 80% for Year 12 Mathematics Standard 2.

If the above entry requirements are not met, a course eligibility assessment will be conducted based on HSC subject results. Applicants who have not completed the HSC will be assessed on a case-by-case basis taking into account the applicant's work and life experience.

GUARANTEED* ENTRY INTO UOW BACHELOR:

Successful completion of the UEC provides guaranteed* entry to most UOW undergraduate bachelor degrees. There are no pathways from this course into double degrees, four-year professional degrees, Law, Nutrition and Dietetics, Nursing or Economics and Finance. Entry to Education degrees are not guaranteed; limited places are available. If you wish to enter into one of the above study areas, please contact us to discuss alternative pathways available.

Special Tertiary Entrance Program - STEP to UOW (School Leavers)

FEE FREE. NO COURSE COST

All STEP to UOW students receive a Commonwealth Supported Place, with tuition fees funded by the Commonwealth Government. There are no student contribution fees required for this program.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The STEP to UOW Program is a university preparation program for students who have experienced disadvantage during their secondary school education. It is a two-session pathway program to help students who may not have otherwise qualified for direct entry to UOW.

You will develop study skills and habits, including time management, essay writing, group work and presentation skills, and become familiar with the academic standards and expectations at university.

INTAKES:

Autumn Session (February) Spring Session (June) Summer Session (October)

CAMPUS:

UOW College Wollongong

DURATION:

Two sessions (14 weeks per session) full time (average three to four days per week), or part-time equivalent.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

To be considered for entry into STEP to UOW, you need to be able to demonstrate that your school studies have suffered hardship^ because of circumstances beyond your control. The criteria for STEP to UOW include one or more of the following: financial hardship; disrupted schooling; home and environment responsibilities; English language difficulty; or personal illness/ disability. Applicants must submit a written application addressing equity criteria listed above.

Applicants are also required to have completed Year 12 within the last 2 years. Applicants who have completed Year 11 are encouraged to apply and will be considered for assessment. All applicants will be assessed on equity criteria. Subject results will also be considered.

If any of the above entry requirements are not met, applications will be assessed on a case-by-case basis taking into account the applicant's work and life experience.

GUARANTEED* ENTRY INTO UOW BACHELOR:

Successful completion of the STEP to UOW program provides guaranteed* entry to most UOW undergraduate bachelor degrees. There are no pathways from this course into double degrees, four-year professional degrees, Law, Nutrition and Dietetics, Nursing or Economics and Finance. Entry to Education degrees are not guaranteed; limited places are available.

^ The categories of hardship and the required supporting documentation for STEP to UOW applications are outlined in the application form and are similar to the UAC (Universities Admissions Centre) Educational Access Scheme (EAS). Students who have submitted EAS applications are encouraged to apply for STEP to UOW.

Diploma of Business

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The Diploma of Business is an in-depth preparation program which provides guaranteed* entry into the second year of a Bachelor of Business or Bachelor of Commerce at UOW.

The development of tertiary skills is embedded in all subjects in the Diploma of Business, which prepares you for successful participation in the second year of the degree. The diploma places an emphasis on a range of oral, written and presentation skills, including group work.

INTAKES:

Autumn Session (February) Spring Session (June) Summer Session (October)

CAMPUS:

UOW College Wollongong: Autumn, Spring, Summer Sessions

UOW College South Western Sydney: Autumn (2 Session program only) and Summer (3 Session program only)

Two or three sessions (14 weeks per session) full time, or parttime equivalent

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

- 2 Session Minimum ATAR 45.
- 3 Session Minimum ATAR 40.

If the above entry requirements are not met, a course eligibility assessment will be conducted based on HSC subject results. Applicants who have not completed the HSC will be assessed on a case-by-case basis taking into account the applicant's work and life experience.

GUARANTEED* ENTRY INTO UOW BACHELOR:

If you achieve a final mark of at least 50 per cent in all subjects of the Diploma of Business you will receive 48 credit points (entry to second year) towards a Bachelor of Business or Bachelor of Commerce offered at all UOW campuses (excluding the UOW Sydney CBD Campus).

A recognised Higher Education Diploma qualification is awarded upon completion, which can be used to pursue entry level career opportunities.

Diploma of Engineering

UAC Code 759050

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The Diploma of Engineering is an in-depth preparation program designed to provide a guaranteed* pathway into the second year of a Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) at UOW. The program of study involves first-year core engineering subjects, which include theoretical and practical units, and hands-on experience. You will also develop tertiary academic skills in preparation for study at UOW. Elective subjects provide an opportunity to explore various engineering disciplines.

INTAKES:

Autumn Session (February) - 2 Session program only Summer Session (October) - 3 Session program only

UOW College Wollongong

DURATION:

Two or three sessions (14 weeks per session) full time, or part-time equivalent

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

- 2 Session Minimum ATAR 60, plus minimum 50% in Year 12 HSC Mathematics 2 Unit and Physics.
- 3 Session minimum ATAR 55, plus Year 12 HSC Mathematics 2 Unit (any result) or minimum 80% in Year 12 HSC Mathematics Standard 2.

If the above entry requirements are not met, a course eligibility assessment will be conducted based on HSC subject results. Applicants who have not completed the HSC will be assessed on a case-by-case basis taking into account the applicant's work and life experience.

GUARANTEED* ENTRY INTO UOW BACHELOR:

If you achieve a final mark of at least 50 per cent in all subjects of the Diploma of Engineering, you will receive 48 credit points (entry to second year) towards a Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) at UOW.

A recognised Higher Education Diploma qualification is awarded upon completion, which can be used to pursue entry level career opportunities.

This course is jointly delivered by the University of Wollongong and UOW College.

Diploma of Information Technology

UAC Code 759010 Wollongong UAC Code 759015 South Western Sydney

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The Diploma of Information Technology (IT) provides a guaranteed* pathway into the second year of a Bachelor of Information Technology, Bachelor of Business Information Systems, or Bachelor of Computer Science at UOW.

The Diploma of IT covers a range of information systems, information technology and business topics and will help you build skills for a future in IT. Tertiary skills development embedded in the Diploma of IT prepares you for successful participation at UOW.

INTAKES:

Autumn Session (February) Spring Session (June) Summer Session (October)

CAMPUS:

UOW College Wollongong: Autumn, Spring, Summer sessions UOW South Western Sydney: Autumn, Spring (2 Session program only) and Summer (3 Session program only) sessions

DURATION:

Two or three sessions (14 weeks per session) full time, or part-time equivalent

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

- 2 Session Minimum ATAR 55, plus minimum 60% in Year 12 HSC Mathematics Standard 2.
- 3 Session Minimum ATAR 50, plus minimum 60% in Year 12 HSC Mathematics Standard 2.

If the above entry requirements are not met, a course eligibility assessment will be conducted based on HSC subject results. Applicants who have not completed the HSC will be assessed on a case-by-case basis taking into account the applicant's work and life experience.

GUARANTEED* ENTRY INTO UOW BACHELOR:

If you achieve a final mark of at least 50 per cent in all subjects of the Diploma of IT, you will receive 48 credit points (entry to second year) towards a Bachelor of Information Technology, Bachelor of Business Information Systems, or Bachelor of Computer Science at UOW.

A recognised Higher Education Diploma qualification is awarded upon completion, which can be used to pursue entry level career opportunities.

Diploma of Science^

UAC Code 759040

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The Diploma of Science is an in-depth preparation program which provides a guaranteed* pathway into the second year of a Bachelor of Science at UOW. It is designed to empower you to apply scientific thinking and analysis to important issues impacting the world today. COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The Diploma of Nursing is designed to assist you to develop your knowledge, skills, and attributes for practice as an Enrolled Nurse. You will learn how to communicate effectively with patients and other staff, administer and monitor medications, manage the care of wounds and prepare health assessments and care plans. You will also benefit from clinical placements in which you will work as part of a team and under the supervision of Registered Nurses. This is a nationally recognised qualification that is accredited by the Australian Nursing and Midwifery Accreditation Council (ANMAC).

Students who successfully complete the Diploma of Nursing are eligible to apply for registration as an Enrolled Nurse with the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia (NMBA). The Diploma of Nursing can be used to apply for entry into the second year of the Bachelor of Nursing at UOW or as direct entry into the workforce following NMBA registration as an Enrolled Nurse.



SCHOLARSHIPS AND FUNDING



SMART & SKILLED GOVERNMENT FUNDING

To be eligible for Smart and Skilled government subsidised training with UOW College, you will need to meet all of the following criteria:

- 15 years old or over: AND
- no longer at school: AND
- living or working in NSW: AND
- an Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident, Australian permanent humanitarian visa holder or New Zealand citizen.

If you are eligible for Smart and Skilled funding, you may also be eligible for a fee free scholarship as a component of Smart and Skilled, which means you will not have to pay any portion of the fee, if you satisfy certain concession criteria.

SMART AND SKILLED FEE-FREE SCHOLARSHIPS AND GOVERNMENT SUBSIDISED PLACES

The NSW Government's Smart and Skilled Fee-Free Scholarships mean that you can obtain the skills you need for the job you want and your course fees are covered. Fee-Free Scholarships are intended to help people (15-30 years old) who are concession-eligible to undertake training under Smart and Skilled. All Certificate III and Certificate IV level qualifications at UOW College are approved for Smart and Skilled funding, including Traineeship delivery.

HAVE AN EXISTING QUALIFICATION? YOU MAY BE ELIGIBLE TO ACCESS SUBSIDISED TRAINING

If you meet the personal eligibility criteria for Smart and Skilled, you will have access to training entitlements regardless of the level of any previous qualifications held. This investment supports the Government's Reskilling NSW Strategy aimed at helping people who gained their higher level qualifications previously or from overseas, who require minimal re-training in order to enter, or re-enter, the workforce

SMART AND SKILLED TRAINEESHIPS

Traineeships combine work-based training with an employer and formal training from a training provider and are a great way to be paid for work, learn and earn a qualification. You may be eligible to apply for a subsidised traineeship under the NSW Government's Smart and Skilled funding initiative. The subsidy is available to trainees who are new entrants, but not those who are existing workers. Your employer can confirm your trainee category. As a new entrant trainee, you are eligible for a government subsidy for your traineeship qualification, even if you already have a Certificate IV or higher qualification. If you have completed a traineeship at school, this will not affect your eligibility for Smart and Skilled subsidised training after you leave school. If you're starting your training with your training provider in a subsidised traineeship, your Smart and Skilled student fee for the whole qualification will not be more than \$1,000.



COMMONWEALTH SUPPORTED PLACE

Under a Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP), the Australian government will cover the entire tuition fee if eligible.

- All students enrolled in the STEP to UOW program receive a CSP and are not required to pay a student contribution.
- Students enrolling in the University Access Program (UAP) are encouraged to apply for a CSP. There are limited places available. If successful, no student contribution is applicable. If your application for a CSP is unsuccessful, the course fee will be payable.

To be eligible to receive a Commonwealth Supported Place, you will need to meet the identified eligibility requirements which may include the below criteria:

- Financial hardship
- Disrupted Schooling
- Severe family disruptions
- Long-term condition or ongoing effect of abuse
- Post school leavers who completed HSC in the last three years and haven't undertaken any additional study
- Have attended an In2Uni High School
- Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander

STUDENT LOANS

FEE-HELP

FEE-HELP is an Australian Covernment income contingent loan scheme that is part of the Higher Education Loan Program (HELP). FEE-HELP assists eligible students pay their tuition fees and is available for the following UOW College courses:

- University Entrance Certificate
- University Access Program
- Diploma of Arts^
- Diploma of Business
- Diploma of Engineering
- Diploma of Information Technology
- Diploma of Science^
- Diploma of Social Science

VET STUDENT LOANS*

VET Student Loans is an Australian Government income contingent loan scheme that is part of the Higher Education Loan Program (HELP) and replaces the VET FEE-HELP scheme from 1 January 2017. VET Student Loans assists eligible students enrolled in approved Vocational Education and Training (VET) courses at approved training providers pay their tuition fees subject to a maximum loan amount. VET Student Loans is available for the Diploma of Nursing (HLT54115).

VET Student Loans will only be approved for students who meet eligibility requirements. A VET Student Loan gives rise to a HELP debt that continues to be a debt due to the Commonwealth until it is repaid.
