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CHC33021 Certificate III in Individual Support

1. Course description

The CHC33021 Certificate III in Individual Support is your entry point into a rewarding career supporting people in aged care, disability, and community services. This nationally recognised qualification equips you with the practical skills and knowledge to provide person-centred support in community, home, and residential care settings, working under supervision as part of a multidisciplinary team.

At UOW College Australia (UOWCA), you can tailor your studies through three specialisations:

- Ageing
- Disability
- Ageing and Disability

You will learn to support individuals with daily living activities, promote independence and wellbeing, and work safely and effectively in accordance with care plans, organisational policies, and industry standards. The course includes mandatory work placement, enabling you to apply your skills in real-world care environments.

Graduates may find employment as support workers, care assistants, residential care workers, community care workers, or disability support workers across a range of care settings.

This qualification also provides a pathway into further study, including the HLT45121 Diploma of Nursing. This course is designed for domestic students studying in Australia.

2. How you'll learn

We offer flexible study options to suit your needs:

- **Face-to-face** – on campus (Wollongong)
- **Traineeships** – earn and learn in the workplace (available across NSW)
- **School-Based Traineeships (SBAT)** – earn and learn in the workplace while undertaking the HSC in Years 11 and 12 (available across NSW)
- **Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)** – experienced care support workers may have their skills and knowledge recognised through a process of RPL.

In addition to scheduled classes, you'll need to dedicate up to 12 hours of additional study per week. This includes time for reading, completing assessment tasks, and viewing online content. Be sure to plan out your weekly schedule.

3. Course and Units of Competency

Students are required to study 15 Units of Competency, 9 Core and 6 Elective, throughout the duration of this course and complete 120 hours of work placement.

4. Delivery and class attendance

UOW College offers a number of flexible options for students to access this qualification.

Face to Face

- UOW College Australia @ UOW Wollongong Campus, Northfields Ave, Wollongong
- Tuesday – Wednesday 9.00am-3.00pm and
- Duration 5 months

Traineeship

- Delivery to be advised at enrolment.
- Typically online classes and workplace for practical assessments
- Duration 12 – 18 months

School Based Apprenticeship / Traineeship (SBAT)

- Delivery to be advised at enrolment.
- Students can commence from Term 4 in Year 10
- Typically, 1 hour per week online classes and workplace for practical assessments
- Duration 2 years

RPL

- Delivery will be advised prior to enrolment.

To ensure students have sufficient class time to learn and understand course requirements, UOW College requires a minimum of 80% class attendance. Students who do not meet this minimum will be identified as 'at risk' and measures put in place to assist course progression.

5. Work Placement

Work placement allows you to practice and develop your skills. This qualification requires 120 hours of work placement which is undertaken during the course. UOW College will organise your work placement.

Prior to going on work placement you will be required to provide the following mandatory checks & clearances

- National Police Check
 - Must be current and meet host employer requirements
- NDIS Worker Screening Check
 - Required for disability-focused placements
- Working With Children Check (WWCC)
 - Required where placement involves interaction with minors

6. What you will need

- Laptop (and charger) with Microsoft Office installed
- Suitable shoes for practical Simulation Labs and Work Placement
- UOW College will provide a polo shirt for you to wear throughout your work placement.

7. Assessment

- Each assessment task will be marked either Satisfactory OR Unsatisfactory.
- You are required to get each question correct or perform each task correctly to be Satisfactory in an assessment task – there is NO grading. You have 2 attempts at each assessment task.

- It is important to get all assessment in by the due date. Talk to your trainer as soon as you are aware of a genuine situation where you may require an extension – note extensions will not be granted within three days of the due date.
- You need to be awarded Satisfactory (S) in all assessment tasks to be deemed Competent (C) in a Unit of Competency

8. Student expectations, conduct and academic integrity

- UOWC has standards, codes, policies, guidelines, procedures and other requirements which specify acceptable and unacceptable student conduct, to provide a safe learning environment for all.
