You'll also get a Higher Education Diploma qualification which you can use to start your career. Eligible students receive a Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP) that covers part of the tuition fee.

### Prepare for success with a Bridging Course

The Academic Bridging Course in mathematics is a short course aimed to improve students mathematical skills to fulfill the prerequisites necessary for successfully pursuing engineering studies at UOW College.

<sup>°</sup>Students who have not attained a minimum of 80% in Year 12 HSC Mathematics Standard 2 (while fulfilling all other requirements) have the option to complete the 'Academic Bridging Course - Mathematics.' If a 'Satisfactory' result is achieved, this can be used as entry into the Diploma of Engineering.

Scholarships are also available.

The Certificate III in Individual Support reflects the role of workers in the community and/or residential settings who follow an individualised plan to provide person-centred support to people who may require support due to ageing, disability or some other reason.

On successful completion of the Certificate III in Individual Support, you have the opportunity to progress to the CHC43015 Certificate IV in Ageing Support or the HLT54121 Diploma of Nursing, with credit arrangements. However, meeting additional UOW College entry requirements is necessary for this progression.
